DIVISION 1 (Sections 1-14)

Section & Description

1. **TANTALIZING TASTE** - a herb planter. List plant names on tag.
2. **ALL IN THE FAMILY** – A display (arrangement to count) of potted plants. One kind eg. ivies, geraniums, coleus, begonias, cactus, etc. Four (4) feet of table space minimum 122cm.
3. **FERN(S) IN A PORCH POT** - named if possible.
4. **URN OF ORNAMENTAL SWEET POTATO VINE(S)**
5. **DRAIN THE BIRDBATH** – a birdbath used as a planter
6. **A PLANTER OF JUST COLEUS** – Named if possible.
7. **A TROUGH GARDEN** –made of hypertufa(cement and peat). No accessories. Dishpan size (approx). Any type of material.
8. **LOOK AT ME** – a specimen potted plant. Named.
9. **ON THE EDGE** –an abstract collage, created by gluing plant material and usually other objects on a flat surface. The collage is done in low relief 5cm (2”). Equipped to hang. *See Pub.34 Judging Standards, page 93.
10. **QUILT BLOCK** – using a 9” square cake pan. Mainly FRESH plant material. Cut your plant material short and develop a pattern. *See pub 34, Judging Standards, page 102 “Pave”.
11. **ONE FOR THE BIRDS** – a decorated bird house with Natural materials. No artificial plant material. Equipped to hang.
12. **HOOPS AND LOOPS** – a miniature design. Dried and/or preserved plant material. Overall design not to exceed 12.7cm (5in) in any direction. Measure!
13. **THE GOOD EARTH** -a Still Life Design – in which plant material and inanimate objects are grouped together to tell a story in a unified display. Staged in a niche 91.5cm high by 76cm wide (36” high and 30” wide). Lattice background available if desired.

18. **“SPIRIT OF FALL”** - A foliage design. Table space 76cm (30”)
19. ***SNAP, SNAP, SNAP** - A parallel design. A design in which 3 or more groupings are placed in a parallel manner with open spaces between the groupings. Staged on tables 81cm high x 76cm wide (36”h x 32”w). See Pub. 34, Judging Standards, Page 102.
