Racing Returns to Western Fair

After a three month summer break, live racing returns to Western Fair Raceway in London, Ontario, this evening with exciting action on and off the half-mile track.

The top three-year-old trotting colts in the lucrative Ontario Sires Stakes program will compete in two \$40,000 eliminations which feature the stars of this division including the leading point earner to date Equity. A son of Kadabra, Equity comes into tonight's contest with 10 wins and three seconds in 14 starts this year for \$363,820 in earnings. Breeder Chris Christoforou trains the talented youngster and co-owns with Banjo Farms of Toronto. Jack Moiseyev will drive from post seven in the first elimination, race four.

Headlining the second test, race eight, is I Won't Dance from post four for Trevor Ritchie. The Angus Hall gelding defeated Equity in the most recent Gold Final, at Rideau Carleton. Currently second in the point standings, I Won't Dance is trained by Per Henriksen for the Mario Blasuzzi Stable. The top four finishers from each division will return to compete in the \$130,000 final next Friday night.

New this fall at Western Fair Racetrack, which features racing Mondays and Tuesdays beginning at 3:35 p.m. and Fridays and Saturdays with a 7:05 p.m. post, is announcer Peter Kyte, who will make his debut this evening.
